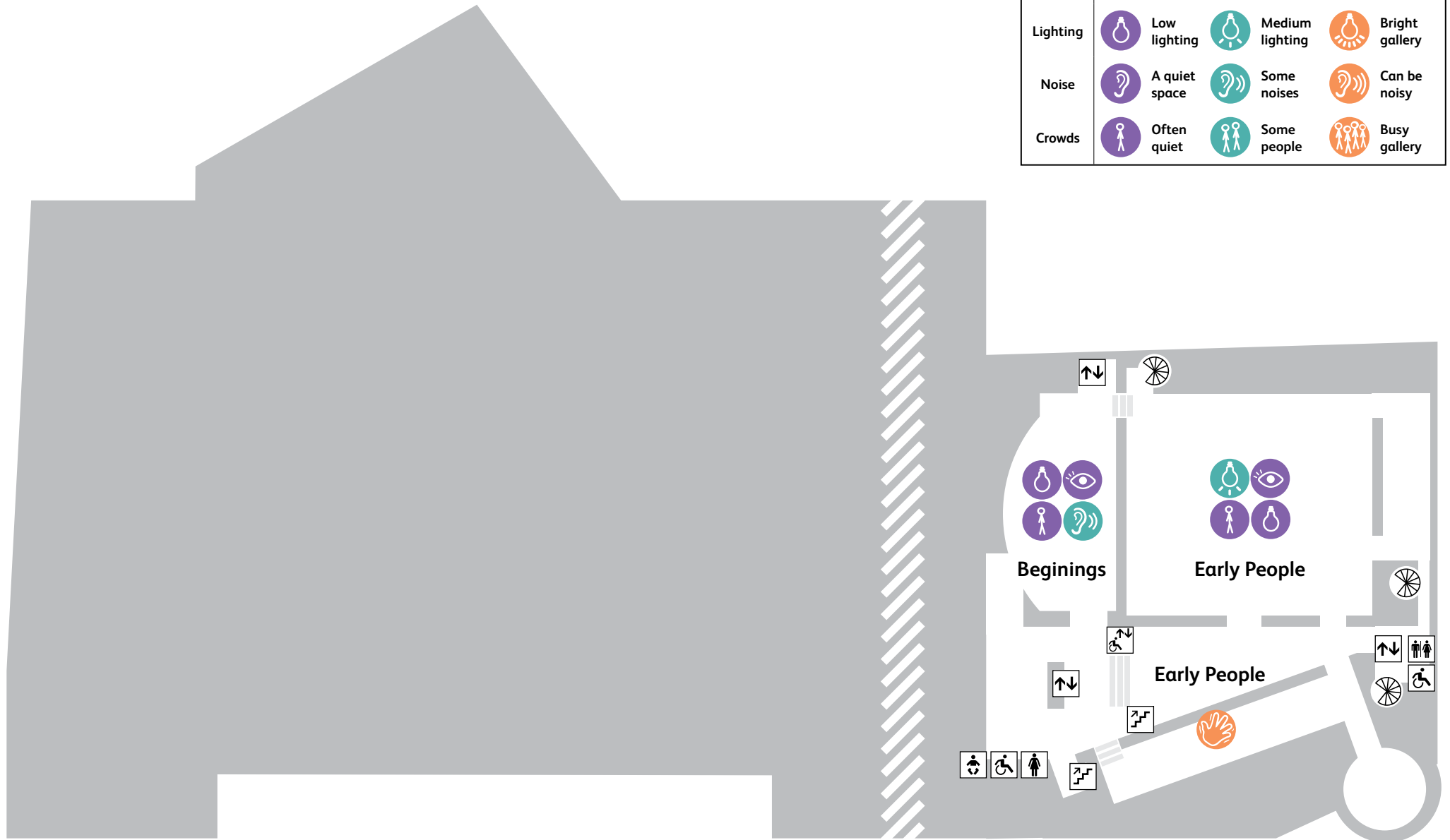

Useful information when planning your visit

- The Tower Entrance is usually the quietest entrance and offers step-free access into the Museum
- Sensory bags and resources are available to borrow from the information desks at the Main Entrance and the Tower Entrance
- Picnic spaces are available – please speak to a member of staff for information
- There are Discovery Zones in some of the Scottish Galleries with hands on activities
- The Millennium clock in Discoveries chimes on the hour every hour and the Richie clock in the Grand Gallery will sound every 15 minutes
- A quick way to exit the Scottish galleries is highlighted in green on the map 
- Enclosed lifts can be found in the Natural World and the Science & Technology galleries
- Less busy times to visit include Monday–Thursday, 15:00–17:00 and weekends 10:00–11:00. Sunny days are usually less busy too
